Unlike the great Chicago fire, the only one with which it can be compared, the residence district of the city was not invaded by the flames. and there will be no physical suffering except, perhaps, that food supplies may be scarce for a few days, owing to the destruction of all the great commission and produce houses.

The city is under martial law, and no one except those who have business within the lines is admitted to the district covered by the fire. The best of order has been preserved throughout, and at all times the police and military have had the situation well in hand and not a single case of looting has been reported The local police have been reinforced by details from Washington and
