Territorial Precedents. Four years ago the Democratic party denounced the acquisition of the Philippine Islands by the United States as a dangerous form of national expansion militarism. The only logical conclusion of this position was our immediate retirement from the Islands, leaving them to shift for themselves. In his letter accepting the nomination for Vice President in 1900 Mr. Roosevelt commented on this position as follows:

"The simple truth is that there is nothing even remotely resembling 'imperialism' or militarism involved in the present development of that policy of expansion. which has been part of the history of America from the day when she became a nation. The words mean absolutely nothing as applied to our present policy in the Philippines, for this policy is only imperialistic in the sense that Jefferson's policy in Louisiana was imperialistic; only military in the sense that Jackson's policy towards the Seminoles or Custer's towards the Sioux embodied militarism: ducing evil results at home now than there was of its interfering with freedom under Jefferson or Jackson, or in the days of the Indian wars on the

The only certain way of rendering it necessary for our Republic to enter on a career of 'militarism' would be to abandon the Philippines to their own tribes, and at the same time either to guarantee a stable government among these tribes or to guarantee them against outside interference. A far larger army would be required to carry out any such policy than will be required to secure order under the American flag: while is really the only possible security against outside aggression.
