Many seed men this season offer foreign alfalfa seed only, others mix one-fourth American grown and threefourths foreign, making a product at about two and onehalf cents per pound under fancy home grown seed. You can easily detect imported seed by the brown berry. rather small in size and having a somewhat shriveled appearance. A close inspection will also discover adulterated seeds where the bright yellow berry is mixed with foreign seed.

Seeding land to alfalfa ia expensive, the seed being only a small part of the necessary outlay, and it is false economy to buy poor seed at any price.
