Lake Tahoe

Opening of the Shoshoni Reservation.

Registration for the drawing of the land of the Shoshoni Reservation will begin at Shoshoni and Lander Wyo., July 16th., and continue to July 31st, inclusive. Drawing for the land will take place at Lander Wyo., beginning August 4th., and continue until the land is disposed of. The land will be opened for settlement August 13th., 1906. There will be about 1,140,000 acres thrown open to settlement. The Engineering Department of the State of Wyoming has completed final arrangements for the irrigation of a large part of these lands by use of the abundant water supply of the Big Wind river. Making it one of the finest and cheapest irrigation projects in the west.
