Synopsis of the proceedings of the Board of Supervisor.

Columbus, Nebr., August 15, 1906.

The petition of Franz Leuchinger and others for the location of a public road commencing at a point on the line of the public road designated on the road plat of the county as "School Section Road" about five chains west of the northeast corner of the S E 1/4 of S E 1/4 of section 15 town 18 range 1 east and running thence in a southerly direction to a point 150 feet south of the center of said School Section Road at or near the northeast corner of the S E 1/4 of S W 1/4 of said section 15, said location to be made for the purpose to avoid the building of a bridge across a deep ditch or washout now being in said road. Also for the vacation of all that part of the School Section Road commencing five chains west of the northeast corner of the S E 1/4 of S E 1/4 of said section 15 and S W 1/4 of said section 15, was presented and read and on motion referred to the committee on roads and bridges.

The communication of Joseph Kraus representing that there is located a public road along the south side of the S E 1/4 of section 35 town 20 range 2 west, that same is obstructed by a fence which is a hindrance to the free use of the road and a damage to the land of the undersigned, therefore asks the board of supervisors to take such steps as will cause said fence to be removed, was presented and read and on motion referred to the committee on roads and bridges and deferred till next meeting of the board.

The survey, plat and field notes of the Beutcher Road in Bismark township were presented by county surveyor Rositer and on motion of supervisor Held approved by the board.
