## THE SALARIES OE GERMAN

 PROFESSORSEditor Nebraskan:
No. 38, page 2, of the Dally Nebrazkan contanas an eaitorial notice and a elipping from the Chicago Record-Herald on the satarles of German prefessors. While the statements of the Record-Herald are more or less accurate, they fall to give a true representation of the German professors' financial status.
The salaries of instructors in many German unfversities is as follows: full professors, 81,500 ; professors (extraordinary.) 8300 as a minimum; docents nothing at all. All receive student fees. If the instructor is especially "abie and learned" these fees often amount to a large sum. We estimated during my studen davs at Heidelberg, that Victor Meyer, professor of chemistry recelved $\$ 10,000$ yearly.
Even men of no special fame recelve fair salaries. I have a German friend who is professor of physics in a Gymnasium. His salary is 81,000 and he earns at least $\$ 500$ yearly by giving private instruction for fees.
Germany is a country of comparatively low salaries. Many of the highest officers in the army reneive no salaries and are supported by their (or their wives') private fortune. common soldier recelves as wages, cents per day.

These figures are given witheut
furtber comment. The readers of the Nebraskan will probably be able to form an opinion as to whether or not a relatively "Low Pav fo Bralns' prevalls in German schools.

The called meetling a week ago Thursday had adopted the contsitution arter making some amendments the most vital of which.Ewas the striking out of the word e"male' from the membersnip clause. This action gave women membership priv lleres in the assoclation.
The association Saturday, after voting the Thursday meeting illegal. took up the further consideration of the constitution, from the point which the assoctation had reached when it adjourned two weeks ago saturday. The anrendments made by the special meeting were ignored After some spirited discussion the constitution was adopted.
Accorfling to the new constitution women are excluded from members bip in the association and since only members are allowed to participate In the preliminaries women will have no opportunity to debate in inter state contests unless some further action is taken.
