The difficulty of introducing English into the schools of the Philippines is not so great as has been imagined. Of six hundred native teachers who attended the preliminary normal school of Manila, sixty could speak English and a large per cent of the remainder could understand instruction in the common branches when given in English. The English language is to be taught in every school and native teachers are to have the benefit of an hours instruction in the same each day. There are two things which make the introduction of the language especially easy, first, the eagerness of the people to learn, and second, the capability which the Filipino child has for acquiring languages.
