The loss of the house will amount to about $\$ f, 000$, which be longs to other partles. The house was valued at $\$ 10,000$, insured for *5,000. The loss to the frateroity as a whole, $=$ in the nature of house furnishings and chapter equipments, amounts to about $\$ 1,000$. Of the fourteen men in the house each lost between $\$: 200$ and $: 300$ worth of individual property.
The fire was due to the explosion of a lamp in a room, which the occupants had left for a few moments. As the members of the fraternity had almost all retired for the night, they had a rather cold experience. While the bullding was burning the men succeeded in remov!ng the fraternity piano Chancellor McLean has extended the sympathy of the univeristy of Iowa.
