NEBRASKA-MISSOURI DEBATE.

In the annual debate with the University of Missouri, Nebraska will take the negative of the municipalization of street railways question - the side opposite that on which Nebraska a week ago last Friday night demolished the Colorado college trio. This decision came from the chancellor of the University of Kansas on Wednesday. According to the agreement now in force, the chancellor of Kansas flips a coin one month before the debate to decide who shall take the respective sides.

Nebraska's team, which goes to Columbia, Mo., for the battle on May 9, Charles P. Craft, W. Frederick Meier, Cecil C. North and George A. Lee, is now at work on its case.

The Nebraska-Missouri debate is attracting a good deal of attention in the latter state. The St. Louis papers are sending here for pictures of Nebraska's team.

Here the Kansas-Nebraska conflict is just now of absorbing interest, as it comes before Craft, Meier, North and Lee start away to wind up "in the enemy's country," the season of interstate debating matches.
