Mr. Whitman now lives in Kansas. He was at school in Concord in 1857, when the celebrated men and women who have made the name of Concord a household word all over the world were living. It was his good fortune to form an intimate and life long acquaintance with the Alcott family and to be numbered among Louisa's "boys."
