Professor Emerson, R. C. Pollard and Val Keyser left Friday for Nehawka, where they will be engaged for the week among the fruit orchards of that section in the fertilizing of the trees and propagation by pollen transfer. Grafting will be performed also in the cultivation of new varieties.

President Dean Ringer of the Y. M. C. A. addressed the meeting of the association yesterday afternoon. In his talk he outlined the line of action the association should pursue this year. He also defined fully what the association stood for and what it meant to the student life of the university. He enlarged upon the different phases of the work and urged that those who did not really know just what it meant should make an effort to learn something about it and that as soon as possible. The Glee club sang two selections.

As a result of Saturday's contest, one-state record was broken, while several others were equalled. The pole vault record of 10 feet 3 inches was broken by Ira Kellogg, who succeeded in bringing it up to 19 feet 5 inches. Pillsbury carried off first place in four of the thirteen events, equalling the university record in several of them. Hagensick took first place in three of the events. The one mile race won by States was one of the prettiest events that took place. As shown in Saturday's contest, States has remarkable endurance and runs with an ease which gives promise of making him a strong man for the track team.

Mundorf, who took first place in the mile run last season, came within three seconds of the university record in the two-mile race. This is a very creditable showing, considering the time of the season.

220-yard hurdles—Hagensick, first; Lehmer, second; Burg, third. Time, 28 3-5 seconds.

880-yard run—States, first; Corr, second. Time, 2 minutes, 9 2-5 seconds.

120-yard hurdles—Hagensick, first; Burg, second. Time, 19 1-5 seconds.

Two-mile run—Mundorf, first; Winchester, second. Time, 11 minutes, 24 seconds.

Running broad jump—Hagensick, first; Hewitt, second; Anderson, third; 19 feet 5 1/2 inches.

Shot put—Pillsbury, first; Tobin, second; Martin, third; 34 feet 6 1/2 inches.

Running high jump—Pillsbury, first; Kellogg, second; Noyes, third; 5 feet 10 inches.

Discus throw—Pillsbury, first; Tobin, second; Martin, third; 111 feet.

Pole vault—Kellogg, first; Hagensick, second; Noyes, third; 10 feet 5 inches.

Hammer throw—Tobin, first; Martin, second; Noyes, third; 110 feet.
