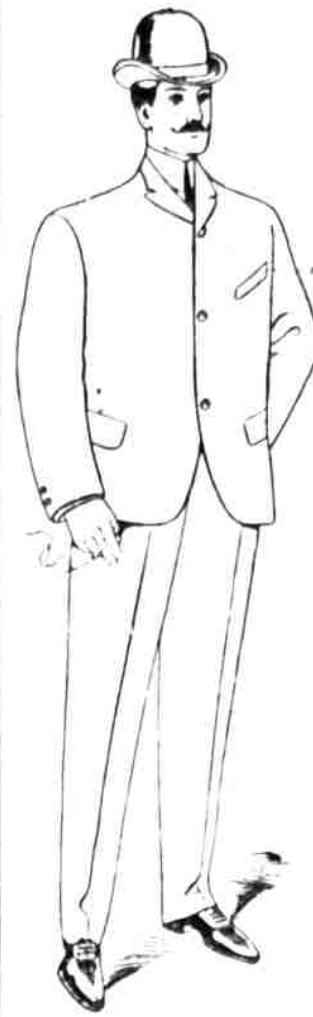
TENNIS MEETING.
