Last week Professor Bessey read a paper before the Nebraska Academy of Science on "The Fuel Value of the Cottonwood," in which he showed that more heat may be grown on a given tract of ground in a given time by planting cottonwood trees than by the use of any other species. This is due to the much more rapid growth of the cottonwood, which much more than balances its low fuel value when measured by the cord. While a given bulk of cottonwood has only about one-half the fuel value of hickory, the former grows so much more rapidly that it yields full weight times as much heat in twenty years of growth.

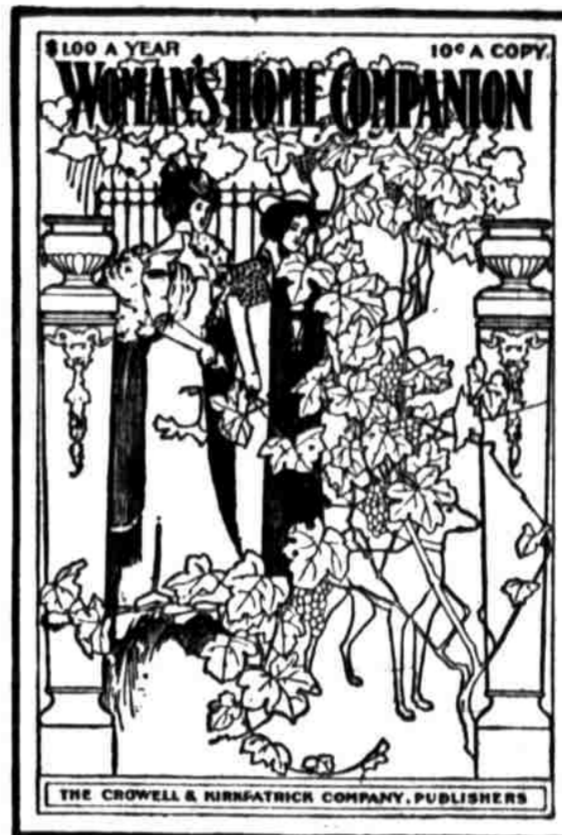
