**IMPORTANT DISCOVERY.**

The Morton history people represented by Mr. Bain, have discovered and photographed an oil painting of Manuel-delisa, the first permanent white settler in Nebraska territory, who settled just north of the city of Omaha in 1807, where he established a trading post with the Indians and remained until 1820. He also established a post at the mouth of the Big Horn river, and tradition goes that his first landing was at Bellevue. However this is not confirmed. The picture of his wife has also been found and will be placed with his in the Nebraska Historical society. The couple were the first pioneers and were certainly the most progressive and successful of the settlers.
