ACADEMY NOTES.

The basket ball game last Friday evening between the Academy girls and the first team of the city Y. W. C. A. was a very pleasant surprise to the friends of the Academy. It was feared that the absence of so many of the former strong players, such as Miss Hazel Cameron and Miss Edna Baker, had badly crippled the team, but at the last moment Miss Cameron entered the lists, and this, coupled with the extra practice, made a new team. Much credit is due Miss Dean for her efficient coaching. Nor do the girls forget the assistance so generously given by Dr. Louise Pound. A large attendance of Academy people rewarded the young women for their hard work. The score stood 20 to 14 in favor of the Academy.

A good attendance of young men met Mr. C. P. Craft last Friday evening. Messrs. Myers, Miller and Morgan took the affirmative and Messrs. Beekley, Shaw and De Young the negative on the question: "Resolved, That all trusts and combination intended to monopolize industries should be prohibited." The affirmative won the decision. Fourteen men have registered for the preliminary debates, the first one of which occurs next Friday evening. This is in preparation for the contest with the Christians of the Halter block. The men of the club are much interested, but regret that three times as many are not members.

In the year and a half that has elapsed since the present principal assumed charge, the attendance has precisely doubled. The gain in school spirit, outside activities, student organizations and spread of the Academy's name and fame, is even more marked. If this continues the present accommodations will hardly last another year.

DR. BESSEY RETURNS.

Is Well Pleased With His Visit at Colorado.

Professor Bessey returned yesterday afternoon from Colorado Springs, where he was in attendance upon the exercises connected with the dedications of the new science building of Colorado College. It is one of the finest buildings devoted to this purpose in the country, and the college has reason to be proud of it. Professor Bessey is loud in his praises of the management of the exercises, and comes back very enthusiastic in regard to everything in Colorado. On Sunday afternoon the dedicatory sermon was given by Professor Moore of Harvard University. On Monday President Van Hise of the University of Colorado, and this was followed by addresses by Professor Bigelow of the University of Michigan, Professor Crow of Northwestern University, and Professor Bessey himself. At these exercises the audiences were large and the room often crowded to an uncomfortable degree. On Monday evening came the formal banquet where more than three hundred college graduates from nearly every college in the country sat down and ate and talked until early morning hours. On Tuesday morning President Jordan gave the formal dedicatory address, and a little later the great building was duly dedicated to science and scientific investigation. There were so many little dinner parties and receptions that the time was well filled. During his stay in Colorado Springs Professor Bessey was the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Stewart.
