Rev. Tuttle at Chapel.

Dr. Tuttle gave a very interesting and profitable talk on religion in college life yesterday at chapel. His was not the spirit of pessimism which fears for the worst in the religious development of the students. On the contrary he was very much encouraged in the outlook for the future. After giving some general statistics showing the religious work accomplished in the colleges of this country, he took up the question of doubt among students. Among the reasons for the existence of doubt is the complete revolution going on in the thoughts of the student as he first enters college.

Everything is different from that which he has been accustomed to. He has looked upon the world as being everything. Now he comes to realize that it is only a part of a vast system. In regard to religious matters his thoughts are changed. He becomes restless and does not give his attention and thoughts to one church, such as he did when at home. He goes to different churches, and has no fixed church home where he can grow it. spiritual development. Another point which Dr. Tuttle emphasized with great force was that there is nothing to glory in, in doubt. The man who glories in doubt displays weakness. No one goes to a man for instruction who says that he don't know. To enforce his point the speaker gave the life of the briliiant scientist, Romanes, as an example. He had been brought up in the English church, but in his scientific investigations had plunged into doubt, but later his faith was restored to him and he died in the bosom of the church.


