Among the Alumni

Professor Bessey read a short notice of the life and work of Thomas A. Williams at the last meeting of the Botanical Seminar. Mr. Williams graduated in 1889 with the degree of B. Sc., and in 1891 he took the degree of A. M. He was the teacher of botany in the Ashland high school for a time, and then was elected to the professorship of botany in the Agricultural College of South Dakota, where he remained until he was called to Washington to take the position of assistant agrostologist in the United States department of agriculture. He proved to be such a good man for this work that he became one of the foremost officers in the division, and is frequently called upon to take up the duties of the chief. All this time he continued his studies of lichens, which he had begun under Dr. Bessey's instruction in the University, and here again he made himself a master of the subject. He died suddenly December 23, 1900. His large collection of lichens, and his botanical library have been deposited in the herbarium of the University, making it the most complete of any in the country. Mr. Williams was one of the charter members of the Botanical Seminar.

Miss Christine Bednar, '03, who is now teaching mathematics and Latin in the Minden high school, writes a friend entertainingly of her experience there. She reports that she has been re-elected for the next year, and with some needed changes in the curriculum looks forward to a year even more successful than the present one has been. She is sure that at least four of the sixteen graduates for this year will enter the university next fall, and several others at a later period. Miss Bednar will be remembered as one of the strong graduates of the University and her success is just what her friends expected.

C. A. Fisher, a former fellow in the geological department, and now engaged in work for the U. S. geological survey, is at present doing work in New Mexico, near the Mexican border. A letter was recently received from him by the geology department.

Prof. C. N. Gould, A. M. 1900, and now of Oklahoma University, is about to move into very fine quarters that have been prepared for the geology department of which he is the head.

Academy Debate To-night.

Addresses were made by H. W. Scott, H. G. Myers and A. H. Miller and encouraging remarks ventured by the principal.
