INTERESTING ADDRESS.

Dr. Ward Talks Before Sigma Xi Society Last Night.

Under the auspices of the Sigma Xi society, Dr. Ward, dean of the Medical school, delivered an exceedingly interesting talk upon the subject "The Responsibility of Mosquitoes in the Transmission of Diseases." Dr. Ward was introduced by Dr. Woulett who in his remarks gave those present an idea of the nature of the organization. Dr. Ward announced in the opening of his address that his talk would be a review of the recent investigations in the subject at hand. The problem of medicine in modern times had changed from the old-time problem of curing diseases to that of the prevention of diseases. The mosquito is a very prominent consideration in this problem. This is a question of very practical importance to the United States now that we have control of some tropical countries. The mosquito is known to carry such diseases as malaria, yellow fever, and elephantiasis. As early as 1848 it was suspected that the mosquito was the carrier of the malarial germ but it was only conclusively established about 1883 by Dr. Ross. By solving the problem of the eradication of the mosquito, malaria will be abolished and an incalculable benefit conferred upon humanity. Dr. Ward discussed the relation of mosquito to yellow fever, tuberculosis and leprosy. From this he passed on to a short discussion macroscopic of the structure of the mosquito and the manner of the transmission of disease.

The habits of the mosquito were next dwelt upon. Standing water on all roofs and dark damp places are the places for the breeding of mosquitoes, as means of eradicating the mosquito, Dr. Ward suggested such mechanical means as protection by mosquito netting, the removing of all breeding places for mosquitoes and the use of oils upon waters where the mosquito breeds. Quinine was also suggested as an excellent drug for the destruction of the malarial parasite when once in blood.

In ending his lecture Dr. Ward delivered a glowing apostrophe to those men who had sacrificed their lives for the eradication of the tropical diseases, yellow fever, malaria and elephantiasis, the black angels of the tropics.

Following the lecture a number of excellent lantern slides were shown illustrating the principle points in the lecture. Dr. Ward is an authority of international repute upon the subject.
