In Other Colleges

For the first time in her history, Yale will hold a summer session next year. She is the last of the universities to conduct a summer school.

Twenty girls from the University of Chicago will charter a special car to Florida during the Christmas vacation. They will visit the John B. Stetson university at De Land, Fla.

The law students of Northwestern have organized themselves into a club. A "house committee" has been appointed who act as a kind of jury in case of violation of any of the rules.

At the University of Chicago the six men appointed on the first and second teams for the final preliminary to select the team to meet Northwestern university, each received a \$50 prize.

It is estimated that 20,000 people visited Yale during the months of July, August, and September to look over the grounds and buildings. This is exclusive of Sundays, which were the popular days.

The Deutscher Verein of the University of Pennsylvania will give a German comedy this year called "Ein Toller Anfall." The play is in four acts, and has a cast of twenty-three characters.
