
Here we are at Frieburg settled to the greatest years work of my life. I wasted some time at Heidelberg, on the supposition that I could be allowed examination privileges at the end of one year, as I have known of that condition in the past there. I was offered the privilege of examination in six months. But I didn't want to do it in so short a time. I know better than anyone that what I want to accomplish and how I want to accomplish it. 
