NEW TREATMENT OF LUMBER.

A novel method for increasing the usefulness of lumber has been perfected in England. The method consists, in brief, in replacing the air in wood with a solution of beet sugar and removing the excess of water by a subsequent drying. The inventor of the process, Mr. Powell, attains his object by using a large boiler in which the timber to be treated is placed and the beet-sugar solution pumped in. After the air has all been replaced by the solution the wood is kiln dried. Examination of the wood seems to show that the sugar is absorbed into the fibre of the woody tissue and is not simply held in the intercellular spaces. It is claimed that timber treated in this way is no longer porous, will not shrink or warp, and is stronger, heavier, and more durable. Moreover, it is said that this wood is not liable to dry rot; it is hoped that by mixing the proper poisons with the sugar bath the wood will be made resistant to the attacks of fungi and insects.—Collier's for February 18.

By the will of Prof. Albert S. Wheeler, late of the Yale Law School, Yale University is to receive his valuable library on Roman Law. This library is one of the most complete in the country on this particular subject.

The University of South Dakota has been negotiating with Iowa for a joint debate between the two colleges. The Iowans have decided that they cannot meet South Dakota this year, owing to the fact that they have scheduled a debate with Nebraska.

It is probable that the University of Pennsylvania will play thirteen games this fall instead of the usual twelve which have been on her football schedule. A new policy will be adopted. Instead of a head coach, an advisory board will supervise the work of a field coach and assistants.

Interest in public speaking at Knox college is at a high pitch. For several years this college has taken a high rank in the west for excellent training in public speaking. Her spirit reached its maximum this year when Ralph E. Chase, the winner of the first prize in the Hamilton club contest at Chicago recently came home. The college closed and the faculty joined the students in a mass meeting to welcome the victorious speaker.
