In Other Colleges

Illinois will uphold the negative in the annual Illinois-Missouri debate this year. The question debated is, Resolved, That the direct property tax should be abolished.
Suit has been brought by the State School Fund Commission of Kansas to recover \$100,000 from Lawrence, Kan. It seems that the city pledged that amount when the University was located there.

The faculty of the University of Oregon have ruled that no student can enter more than two kinds of athletics. Because of this Oregon is not to have a varsity basketball team this year. The men who would play the game are interested in both baseball and track work.

Jiu-jitsu, the Japanese system of self-defense, has been taken up quite extensively in the University of Pennsylvania and a course in this sport has been made compulsory at Annapolis.

A newspaper report is authority for the statement that the trustees of Lawrence University refused a bequest of \$100,000 because the donor lost his life in the Iroquois fire. They do not believe that it would be right to accept the money given by a man who would attend a theater.

Seven freshmen of Northwestern University were so severely hazed recently that the cases of three will probably prove fatal. The hazing consisted of thrusting the boys into a greasy wooden chute, down which they shot 30 feet into a sandpit filled with water and floating ice. They were fished out by means of a lasso, and were then compelled to walk home in their wet clothing.

At a meeting of the presidents and deans of Ohio colleges at the Chittenden hotel, professionalism in college athletics was deplored. Two remedies were suggested to obviate the evil—(1) that no freshman be allowed to play football or any other college sport in an intercollegiate match during his first year; and (2) that a student who transfers from one institution to another must spend a year there before engaging in athletics. These reforms will be inaugurated probably next year.
