### Engineering Notes.

T. Sammons, Mechanics Arts, '03, was a visitor on the campus this week.

Professor Sweezy is considering the possibility of designing a twelve-inch telescope and has secured the co-operation of the shop department to build the mountings.

The Department of Mechanical Engineering has purchased a gas blast furnace to be used in all kinds of tempering and hardening of tools. This will be very valuable in the machine shops as a greater variety of tools can be made.

The students in the machine shops are building twenty-five complete wood turning lathes, to be used in the wood shops. It will require considerable time for their completion. The department has finished some first-class machines, notably the shaper which was built last year at a considerable saving over the cost if it had been bought complete.

At the meeting of the Engineering Society last Wednesday evening, after the usual business, L. E. Hertz, '03, of the Lincoln Gas and Electric Co., gave a very interesting talk on the Nernst electric light. He explained in detail the construction of the lamp and exhibited some of various sizes as used in Lincoln. The company here in Lincoln is keeping a careful record of the cost for repairs, electricity, etc., with the intention of knowing definitely how they compare with the air light as used for store illumination. At present they compare very favorably and better results are expected as they become more generally used.
