**In Other Colleges**

The University of Kansas is to award the athletic "K" to any of her students breaking a university record.

The residence of the late Mrs. Jane Stanford has been bequeathed to Stanford University. The house, with its grounds and contents, is valued at \$2,300,000.

Michigan defeated Purdue Saturday in a dual track meet by a score of 54 to 10. Purdue secured no first and but three seconds. The pole vault was tied at 11 feet 3 inches.

At a recent meeting of the undergraduate body of the University of California a proposal to establish the honor system in examinations was defeated. The majority of women voting were in favor of the honor system.

Columbia University won the eastern inter-collegiate basketball championship again this year with a record of eight victories and no defeats. Yale won second place and Princeton third. This is the second consecutive championship year for Columbia.

The debate between Iowa and Minnesota which was announced to have been held at Minneapolis last night was called off by Minnesota because suitable judges for the contest could not be secured. The debate between these two universities at Iowa City two weeks ago resulted in a tie, and the tie was expected to have been played off last night.

Columbia University won in two debates on Friday evening, one against the University of Pennsylvania and the other against Cornell. The debates were two of the three of the Triangular Debating League which consists of Cornell, Columbia and Pennsylvania. The third debate was won by Cornell from Pennsylvania.

The league holds the three debates every year, each member of the league debating with the other members, sending one team away and keeping one at home. As a result of the contest this year Columbia won two contests, Cornell one and Pennsylvania none.
