ing the custom established some two  
years ago. The date has been set on  
April 8th, in the Art hall. Members  
of all four classes are invited.

Statistics show that some 47 High  
Schools in Nebraska varying from one  
to four years in length. 24 of these  
schools maintain a two semester  
course in German; 13 a 3 semester  
course; 14 a 4 semester course; 4 a  
6 semester course and 2 an 8 semester  
course.

The Teacher's Bureau of the Univer-
