## SUMMER SCHOOL BULLETIN

Courses to Be Offered at Univer-  
sity Summer Session.

The bulletin of the Summer Session of the University is out and being distributed. It contains in full the program and calendar of work for this inter-term session.

This Summer Session begins June 16th, Friday, and continues until Friday, July 28th. On Friday and Saturday of each week lectures by Professors Ross, Barbour, Ward, Lees, Luckey, Swezey, Fossler, Barber, will be given on subjects in which each has done considerable work.

The courses of study which will be occurred during this session are:
