Academy Notes.

The Academy five will play at least three more games before the season closes, the dates for which have not been settled.

Miss Harriet Mitchell, instructor in Physics in the Academy, left last evening for Chicago where she was suddenly called by the serious illness of her father. She will probably return Sunday evening.

The basketball game played last Friday evening in the City Y. W. C. A. gymnasium between the Academy girls team and the Y. W. C. A. five resulted in a victory for the Academy by the score 48 to 33. The Academy five easily outplayed the Christians in the first half, but a change in the Y. W. C. A. lineup at the beginning of the second half made the teams more evenly matched, the half resulting in a tie and the margin between the scores remaining the same as at the end of the initial half, the final score being 48 to 33.

The disfranchisement of the negro was the question up for discussion at the meeting of the Academy Debating Club held last Saturday evening in Academy Hall. Miss Barbour and Messrs. Russel and Smith participated in the discussion of the question. A short preliminary practice was also enjoyed by those present. The question of debates with other schools was not taken from the table and it is probable that no outside debates will be held this year.

After the regular program Professor Hodgman treated the members of the club to ice cream and cake. The principal part of the program added greatly to the pleasure of the evening and those present express themselves as being highly pleased with the entertainment of the evening.

The Academy baseball men are practicing regularly from 5 to 6 p. m. on the vacant lot south of the Academy. About twenty men have been reporting for practice and a team up to the usual standard seems to be assured. Already money enough has been pledged to buy the necessary equipment to conduct practice. Mr. C. A. Perry has been elected manager of the team for the year and is beginning to make out his schedule. The first game will be played with the Lincoln Business College team. The date for this game has not been definitely decided yet but it is expected that it will be played next Saturday afternoon. An effort will be made to secure games with Lincoln High School, Cotner, Wesleyan, the class and society teams of the University.
