**Campus Gleanings**

A course in elementary forestry for teachers of Nature Study in the public schools has been announced by the University authorities.

The time of the meeting at which Miss Corwin was to address the girls of the University which was called for this afternoon has been changed and will be held from 5 to 6 in U 106. All University girls are urged to be present at this meeting.

The Nebraska Entomological Society meets at 7:30 this evening in the Entomological laboratory. S. Goldman will discuss "Insects Affecting Forest Trees," and P. R. Jones' talk on "Some Garden Insect Pests." All who are interested in the study of Entomology are invited to attend the meetings of the Society.

Saturday morning was a busy morning for the practice courts of the Law School. The district court had a new trial of the case of Butler vs. Meier which was tried the week before. The counsel for the plaintiff in error was Luther Kimmel and for the defendant C. T. Borg.

A jury trial, the case of Martin vs. The Lincoln Transfer Co., was held. The attorneys were Weunder for the plaintiff and Carl Peterson for the defendant.

A. C. Meier was tried for contempt of court. He was on the venire for the jury in the trial held a week ago, but failed to make his appearance. Robert Dunley, who was indicted for perjury was arraigned at the same trial.

Among the portraits printed in sepia on India tint paper which adorn this issue is an excellent likeness of Ralph Waldo Emerson which forms the frontispiece of the number.
