

The first topic discussed in the afternoon service was "The Committee's Field." Mrs. Byers, of Omaha, spoke on "The Parable of the Ten Virgins." She showed how imperative it is that every person be prepared to meet God when death overtakes him. Mrs. Piddell, of Omaha, sang several solos and a large chorus of girls under the direction of Mrs. Raymond lead the rest of the singing.
