**Engineering Notes.**

Prof. Richards went to Grand Island to inspect and take a ride on the new U. P. gasoline motor car. This car is used for passenger transportation on a branch road.

A great many trade catalogues and other descriptive matter of modern steam engineering practice have been distributed by Prof. Richards among his classes.

Mr. Rhodes has extended many courtesies to the University not the least of which was the recent presentation of a number of technical to the engineering library.
