In Other Colleges

With 500 students in working attire tugging at a big rope which drew a plow, and giving the college yell with each pull, ground was broken at noon Tuesday for the new \$70,000 gymnasium at Ohio Wesleyan. Prexy Whitlock guided the plow amid the cheers of the co-eds. After a furrow 150 yards long was made, the students rested and listened to speeches.

In the debate between Kansas and Missouri held at Columbia recently the decision was given to Missouri by a vote of two to one. Half an hour later, after the debaters had dispersed, a mistake in the vote was discovered and a decision of two to one in favor of Kansas was announced. The Kansas debating team had the curious experience of losing and winning the same debate.

Max Loeb, of the University of Wisconsin, carried off first honors in the oratorical contest of the Northern Oratorical League last week. The subject of his oration was "Idols and Ideals." The following universities were represented in the contest, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan, Northwestern, Iowa, Chicago and Oberlin college. The winning orator was royally received by his admiring school mates when he returned to Madison.

Owing to the recent exposures of graft at Minnesota the faculty has hit upon the following scheme to prevent further dishonesty: There shall be an auditing committee composed of four faculty members and three students. Each of the three students shall be elected by and shall represent one of the four colleges, Engineering, Academics, Medical and Law and the system will be rotating, one of the four colleges to be unrepresented at each of the annual elections. This committee shall examine the accounts of every student enterprise, not only the publications, but the literary, dramatic and debating societies and all other organizations which are conducted by the student body.
