It seems absolutely impossible to get the squad to work at the afternoon practices, and only one opportunity is given each week to train the men in Nebraska songs and yells. Don't let the fact that grandstand seats are free cause you to forget your duty, but sit in the regular rooters' section of the bleachers, whether it rains or is boiling hot.

**Fraternity Pledges.**

The Nebraskan had intended to publish a list of fraternity pledges today, but for several reasons is unable and unwilling to do so.

As to the fraternities, there seemed to be a strange state of affairs, for the representatives of several fraternities were unable to remember whom they had pledged, there were so many of them, and referred our reporter to some brother, who was in the same fix. It was therefore deemed wise to refrain from publishing the list until these unfortunate fraternities could find time and opportunity to catalogue their new men.

Among the sororities another and far different state of affairs existed. Two or three fair co-eds begged us to hold off just a couple of days, and then they would have another pledge, maybe. From the number of sororities which appealed to us in this manner, it is to be inferred that the high school crop of 1905 was rather unproductive in attractive maidens.

Another obstacle was encountered in the supposedly forgotten rules of the Girls' Pan-Hellenic, made last year, and forbidding the publication of most sorority news. Every sorority, however, seemed willing to break the rule if the others did, and accordingly we have the list of pledges from all the organizations. In compliance with urgent requests, these lists will be open to additions.

It was also our purpose to publish a complete list of fraternity addresses and telephone numbers. It is so early in the year, however, that a number of fraternities are not yet settled completely, and as it is impossible to give a complete list at this time, it also will be held over until Tuesday. The telephone directory, especially, will be useful, as neither telephone company will issue a directory for some time, and the old ones do not contain the recent additions.

**Power-House Improvements.**

Orders have been placed for new light and power plant improvements for the University, which will greatly improve the equipment here. A new 125 horse-power boiler has just come, and will be immediately installed in the boiler-rooms, which will increase the heating plant on the campus about 10 per cent. A new 160 horse-power automatic, high-speed, compound, tandem, non-condensing type engine has been ordered and a 100 kilowatt direct connected direct current generator for the power plant. There is also a new improved switchboard. The old electric equipment is worn out and old-fashioned, and is also inadequate for the University as it is today. With the new equipment the campus will be better lighted and light furnished to all buildings direct. Eventually it is planned to replace all the independent engines over the campus with electric motors controlled from the central power plant, securing considerable economy by this means. One immediate change will be the replacing of the 15 horse-power engine in the machine shop by an electric motor. These improvements will cost altogether about \$16,000 and will be completed some time in November or December.
