Convocation.

Chancellor Andrews will occupy the chapel hour next Monday with a talk on University Co-operation. As this will be the first opportunity to hear Dr. Andrews this year, no one should neglect to attend convocation on that morning. The new Agricultural School buildng at the University farm has been completed and is now being occupied. The building is veneered with pressed brick similar to that used on the new physics building. The general architecture of the building is very pleasing. Inside it is finished entirely in hard wood. This is probably the best building now owned by the University.

Last spring Mr. Magdanz was elected to the position of instructor in animal husbandry in the Agricultural School, and is expecting to take up his duties about November 1st. During the past summer he has been engaged in reporting and editorial work for the Twentieth Century Farmer and in that capacity has just finished visiting and reporting the various state fairs in the western circuit.

New President at Illinois.

The installation of President James of the University of Illinois will take place in about a month, the ceremony extending over three days. Besides having the usual characteristics of such functions, the ceremony will take the form of a civic demonstration, intending to emphasize the intimate organic connection of the University with the education and administration of the State and Nation. Other colleges and universities will be invited to send delegates to these ceremonies.
