DE WITT BRISTOL BRACE.

The University of Nebraska has suf-
fered an irreparable loss by the death
of Dr. Brace. One of the oldest pro-
fessors in the University, he was also
one of the greatest, and it is due to
him as much or more than to any other
member of the faculty that our Uni-
versity has a reputation extending far
beyond the borders of the state and
nation, and that it has reached its
present high rank among the universi-
ties of the world.

If it is possible that any one de-
partment suffers more from his death
than any other, it is the Physics de-
partment, of which he has been the
head for eighteen years. It is to him
that credit must be given for the high
standard reached and maintained by

the high school thirty yard line. The
intervening distance to the goal was
made in slow gains, Cotton going over
for the second score. During this
part of the game Denslow got a bump
on the side of the head and was re-
placed by Colhart. Cotton failed to
kick goal. Score, 10 to 0.

The University received the ball on
the next kick off on the forty yard
line. Gains by Schmidt, Weller, Cot-
ton and Little advanced the ball to
within ten yards of the high school
goal, where a penalty for holding sent
it back ten yards. When the ball
was within five yards of the goal again
it was transferred to the high school
on downs.

Minor fell back for a punt, but when
Collins passed the ball to him he
threw it high above Minor's head and
over the fence into the street. There
was a scramble over the fence for
the ball, and Lundin fell on it where
it lay. After consultation, the officials
allowed the University a touchdown.
Eager tried the goal, but failed. Score,
15-0.

The University secured the ball on
the thirty-five yard line and after sev-
eral downs, Schmidt kicked to Minor,
who returned to the twenty-five yard
line. The high school tried a fake
kick, but did not gain. Taylor was
taken back and given the ball, making
two five yard gains. Weller was sent
over for the final score, directly in
front of the goal posts. Cotton missed
goal. Score, 20-0. The rest of the
game was a punting contest between
Schmidt and Minor, with the result in
favor of the latter.


