**HARD WORK.**

**The 'Varsity Have Some Heavy Games Before Them For the Rest of the Season.**

Saturday the 'varsity will go to Omaha to play the Creighton College team. Last year the 'varsity were held down to a score of 30 to 0 by the Omaha school, in what proved to be a very interesting game. The game this year will be a comparatively easy victory for the 'varsity. Creighton out of the games she has played this year has been defeated in three; Morningside College, Doane, and Bellevue. Bellevue was the most successful, running up a score of 28-0 against the Creighton men. Granting that she has suffered defeat yet Creighton always puts up the game of her life against Nebraska, and as a result the spectators get their money's worth.

After Creighton comes Ames. This will prove to be one of the best games played on the Nebraska field this year. Ames has played the 'varsity but twice before, being defeated once by a score of 30-0, and defeating us at another time by 33-0. More men have tried for the Ames 'varsity team this year than any other team in the west. It is reported that as high as one hundred and fifty men came out to work for a place on the team. From the showing made by Ames thus far we cannot judge as to our chances, as she has played but few hard games.

The Creighton and Ames games will lead up to the climax of the season on our home field, that is, the Colorado-Nebraska game. Owing to the poor showing Illinois has made thus far, the football enthusiasts have come to look upon the Colorado game as the hardest on the home grounds. The defeat received from Colorado last year has not been forgotten, and every student, alumnus, and Nebraska supporter is as anxious to enter the game, and down the western school, as is the team. The Colorado team will come supported by some two hundred rooters, and with the determination to down Nebraska.

Colorado will be followed by the Minnesota game at Minneapolis. Here is where we repeat the 6-0 story of a few years ago. History never repeats, but football scores are duplicated. The 'varsity was never more determined than they are at the present time to give the Gophers the small part of the score. If a reasonable rate is arranged a large number of the students will attend this game.

The season will be closed with the Illinois game on Thanksgiving. It is not necessary to go into detail in regard to this game for it has become too much of a fixture on the Nebraska schedule. Illinois always puts out the best of a team, and the Thanksgiving game is generally the most largely attended of any game of the season. With Doane between the Minnesota and Illinois game the 'varsity should be in good trim for Thanksgiving.

Last night the football men went through some hard practice on the field. Booth lined them up for a short signal practice and scrimmage just before the close of the practice. A good number of the men will be taken to Omaha Saturday, in order that the new men may get some work against the Creighton team. The officials for Saturday's game have not as yet been chosen.
