**COLORADO EXCURSION.**

**Crowd of Rooters to Accompany the Team.**

A dispatch from Boulder yesterday stated that arrangements had been made for an excursion to run from Boulder to Lincoln over the Union Pacific Friday night, and that 300 tickets had been sold already.

This will be good news to Nebraska students, for it will lend an incentive to our own rooting. This is the first time in five years that a visiting team which really had a good chance to defeat us has been accompanied by a more than handful of supporters, and it will mean that the game will be played under conditions as nearly equally favorable to each side as is possible. It will need the greatest effort of every Nebraskan rooter to drown out the voices of the mountaineers, for the air in that country seems to be especially conducive of leather throats, and the Colorado school has a selection of yells which it would be hard to beat anywhere.

The informal last Saturday night was not a success, as the inclement weather kept all but about forty people from attending, and the management as a result lost money. The program will be of sixteen numbers, with two extras. One of the town orchestras will furnish the music.
