Can they so order their lives as to secure the things of real and lasting value—the friendships, the discipline, the help, the culture, the beauty, the pleasure—and eliminate the tawdry,

to visitors does not again suffer as it did last Saturday."

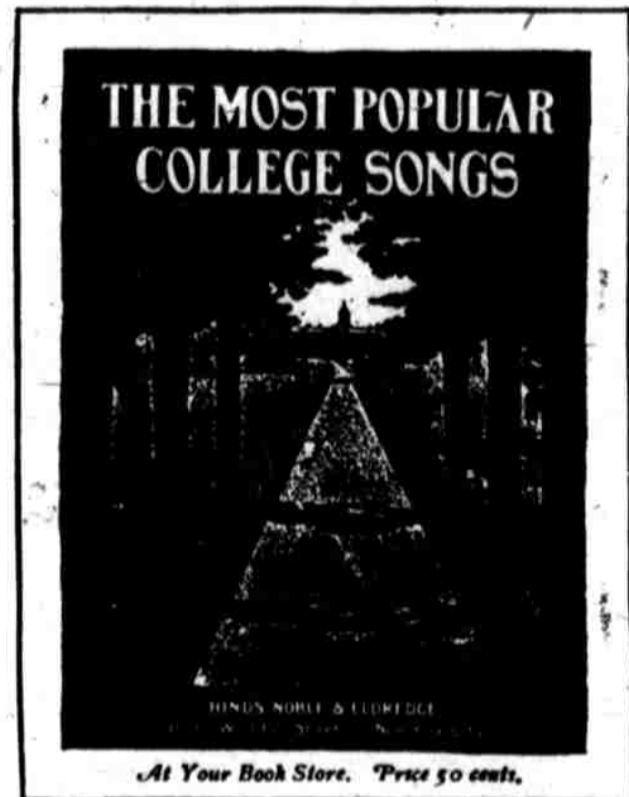
