Convocation.

Prof. J. T. Lees gave an illustrated lecture at convocation yesterday on the University of Athens. Among the characteristic features of Athens, as brought out by the lecture, were irregularity of streets, the number of temples, and the durability of columns of masonry used in the construction of them.

The views illustrated the Tower of the Winds, ancient temples, the different buildings of the University of Athens, the residences of American and English students, and the astronomical observatory, situated on the Hill of the Nymphs. This observatory was built by a wealthy Greek and donated to the state. There is also to be found there a women's college, in which upwards of 1,600 girls receive instruction.

Conspicuous among the statues of Plato and Socrates and other noted men of Greece is the statue erected in memory of Gladstone. Mr. Gladstone was instrumental in prevailing upon the English house of commons to make to Greece a present of the Ionian Islands, which perhaps accounts for the reverence of him by the Greek people.

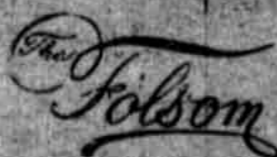
