Prof. George Howison, of the department of Psychology at the University of California, has raised a hornets' net by excluding two members of the "Daily Californian" staff from his class, excepting on condition that they promise not to publish anything he may say. It seems that in the past the worthy professor has been misquoted in some of the city papers, and he feels that college journalists are apt to do the same thing. The newspaper men claim that he has not the right to thus exclude them from his class, as they have all the necessary requirements, and threaten to take the matter before the authorities. Professor Howison has not been bluffed, however, and asserts that he will fight the matter to a finish.
