Mr．A．L．Gale，managing editor of the Daily Star，addressed the students at convocation yesterday on the sub－ ject＂Wealth and Happlness．＂He said in part：

＂Many a beginner today makes the mistake of aspiring to be the greates banker，the greatest lawyer，the grea est doctor or the greatest engineer Don＇t aspire to be great，but aspire to be good，and eventually you may be－ come great，but at all events you will be happy．The late Dr，Harper was a good exsmple of a great and happy though not a wealthy man．He was a good instructor and in time became a great instructor．He was a goód col－ lege professor and in a very short time became a great college professor． He was a good president and at the time of his death was recognized as one of the greatest in his chosen work． The wealth that came to him he gave to others and so made both them and htmself hàppy
＂There never was a better oppor－ tunity to secure happlness，never a better chance to achleve greatness than today．Senator Hoar has ably expressed this thought in the words which he chose for his epitaph：The world is growing better；honesty must ever be a part of happiness，in－ cluded in the mantle of religion．A thousand eplgrams have already been written giving the key to happiness， but perhaps the best one is，that hap－ Dingess is where money madness is not．＇
