(4) The selection and hiring of coaches shall be left entirely in the hands of the trustees of the college.

(5) The coach shall be a member of the faculty, the purely professional paid coach not to be employed.

(6) There shall be no training table or early season practice.

(7) No man shall play for more than three years in any intercollegiate sport.

(8) No university team shall play with high schools, academies or independent professional schools.

(9) The admission to all athletic meets shall be limited to fifty cents for students.

Editor at Convocation.

Mr. A. L. Gale, managing editor of the Daily Star, addressed the students at convocation yesterday on the subject "Wealth and Happiness." He said in part:

"You students are fitting yourselves for various positions in life which in the end have a common goal: money. Economists tell us that, under our present system of government, the accumulation of fortunes is inevitable. But what is the greatest thing in life? The poet tells us it is love; the teacher says it is the accumulation of learning; the preacher says it is the preparation for a future existence; the business man says it is money. They are all correct except the last. Love, learning and religion are the paths in life which lead to happiness. Money alone does not. Money is only conducive to happiness when accompanied by the other three.

"Many a beginner today makes the mistake of aspiring to be the greatest banker, the greatest lawyer, the greatest doctor or the greatest engineer. Don't aspire to be great, but aspire to be good, and eventually you may become great, but at all events you will be happy. The late Dr. Harper was a good example of a great and happy, though not a wealthy man. He was a good instructor and in time became a great instructor. He was a good college professor and in a very short time became a great college professor. He was a good president and at the time of his death was recognized as one of the greatest in his chosen work. The wealth that came to him he gave to others and so made both them and himself happy.

"There never was a better opportunity to secure happiness, never a better chance to achieve greatness than today. Senator Hoar has ably expressed this thought in the words which he chose for his epitaph: 'The world is growing better; honesty must ever be a part of happiness, included in the mantle of religion. A thousand epigrams have already been written giving the key to happiness, but perhaps the best one is, that happiness is where money madness is not.'"
