**DONATION FOR CHICAGO.**

J. D. Rockefeller Contributes \$1,450,000 to Midway School.

A donation of \$1,450,000 is the latest benefaction bestowed on the University of Chicago by John D. Rockefeller. The gift was announced yesterday at a special meeting of the Chicago University board of trustees.

The sum given to the University by Mr. Rockefeller includes \$1,000,000 for the permanent endowment, \$350,000 to cover the current expenditures or deficit of the various departments of the University up to July 1, 1907, and \$100,000, the interest of which is to go to Mrs. William Rainey Harper during her lifetime.
