a meeting upon application of five members, or at any time he thinks advisable.

Section 2. The duties of the officers shall otherwise be such as usually fall to the lot of similar officers in similar organizations.

ARTICLE VII.

Oath.

Section 1. Each initiate shall be required to make the following declaration as a part of his initiation: I, \_\_\_\_\_, hereby promise and declare that while a student at the University and after leaving it I will strive to promote the student welfare of the University, to foster a broad good-fellowship among Nebraska men, to encourage democracy, and to discourage political intrigues which tend to give the student honors to others than those who have merited recognition by unselfish labor in the advancement of the interests of the University.

Section 2. No oath or pledge shall ever be exacted from any member of the club to aid, assist or further the interests of his fellow members except insofar as they may merit it as fellow men and sons as the same Alma Mater.

ARTICLE VIII.

Insignia.

The Commons shall adopt some insignia suitable to be placed on a hsingle or letterhead as a seal, or worn as a pin.

ARTICLE IX.

Amendments.

Section 1. The Commons may by a majority vote of all active members change the number of members to be elected each year.

Section 2. All other amendments to this constitution must be made by a constitutional amendment meeting of the male barbs. Such meeting shall be called by the President of the Associated Barbs at any time he thinks an amendment is necessary. It must be called by him on petition of fifty male barbs. It must be a meeting for this sole and separate purpose. In order to be binding such an amendment must be passed by a two-thirds majority at the amendment meeting.

ARTICLE X.

Adoptoin.

The election of charter members as before provided shall constitute an adoption of this constitution.

ARTICLE XI.

Dissolution.

Once this constitution is adopted if the Commons fail to follow it, such failure shall in itself dissolve the Commons, deprive them of their right to the name Commons and empower the Associated Barbs to elect a new body of men who from that time shall constitute the Commons of the University of Nebraska.
