The University year is divided into four Quarters, Winter, Spring, Summer, and Autumn. Admission is granted at the opening of each, on January 20, April 20, June 10th, and October 20th.

Graduate instruction is offered in the Graduate Schools of Arts and Literatures and in the Ogden (Graduate) School of Science.

Professional instruction is offered in the Divinity School, the Law School, Rush Medical College (affiliated), and the School of Education.

Summer Quarter 1906, June 10-September 1. First Term: June 10-July 20. Second Term: July 27-August 31. Registration is permitted for the entire quarter or for either term. Full and regular credit is given for work done. Special courses are offered for teachers.

GEOGRAPHY SCHOOL.

This school, the first of its kind in the middle west, aims to meet the demand for better instruction in geography and nature study by giving teachers an opportunity to study these subjects under the most favorable conditions and with little expense. Three professors will devote their entire time to instruction, and they are to have assistants in laboratories and in field excursions.

Professor R. H. Wolcott, who for three summers has taught nature study to large and enthusiastic classes in the University of Missouri, is to be one of the three. His work will be of high grade and precisely adapted to public school teachers.

Professor William G. Bishop, former president of the Lincoln Business College, now of Nebraska Wesleyan University, is to teach general geography for grade teachers. He has had experience in all departments of public school teaching.

The director is to devote his time to courses 1, 2 and 3 as outlined.

Besides the regular class work, lecture course 4 is a strong feature of the school. The lectures are to be given by men especially competent to elucidate phases of the general subject.

Five courses are offered at the University of Nebraska and two at Wesleyan. The location of the two Universities makes it possible for teachers to select courses at both places and thus to devote their entire time to geography and nature study.

The registration fee is \$6.00.

A strong lecture course has been arranged as follows:

1. Geography Teaching—Chancellor E. Benjamin Andrews.
2. The Hawaiian Islands—Superintendent N. C. Abbott (illustrated).
3. The Philippines—Superintendent N. C. Abbott (illustrated).
4. China and Japan—Superintendent N. C. Abbott (illustrated).
5. The Yellowstone Park—Professor E. H. Barbour (illustrated with colored slides).
6. The Picturesque Southwest—Superintendent C. M. Barr (illustrated).
7. Relations of Geography and Agriculture—Deputy Superintendent E. C. Bishop.
8. Brazil and Argentina—Professor Lawrence Bruner (illustrated).
9. Under the Mexican Flag—Rev. George L. Gates (illustrated).
10. Soil and Crop Special—Professor T. L. Lyon (illustrated).
11. Our Common Birds—Professor R. H. Wolcott (with specimens).
12. Panama and the Canal Zone—George L. Campen.

The lectures are open to all teachers taking geography and nature study.

Students may secure copies of the special bulletin by calling at the Registrar's office. There can be no doubt but that this school will be one of the most important of the summer session.
