### SANE SPELLING.

College journals, especially in the largest and most influential of our universities, should reflect in their columns any reform in journalism that owes its origin to the careful study of competent men. Such a reform is the "Sane Spelling" of which Chancellor Andrews spoke in convocation this morning.

We have given a resume of the arguments in favor of the adoption of spelling as advocated by the Simplified Spelling Board, elsewhere in this isue, and nothing further needs to be said in our estimation. We simply wish to state our policy for the year in this connection.

So far as it is possible the Daily Nebraskan intends to use the simplified spelling of the three hundred words already proposed by the Board, in all of its items, whether news or editorial. This will necessitate extra proof reading for a time and possibly will produce some confusion between the new spelling and the ordinary method. We hope to overcome both of these difficulties in a short time, however, and remain consistently re-
