# MRS. HOWELL DIES.

Mother of Professor Howell Passes Away After Long Illness.

Mrs. Harriet Howell, mother of Professor Alice Howell of the Department of Rhetoric, died Monday night at midnight after an illness lasting for more than a year.

Mrs. Howell was not at all well for the greater part of last pear and went west with her daughter early in the summer in the hope of regaining her health. The greater part of the summer was spent at Sadro-Wooley, Washington, but a trip to Alaska was also made in the hope of additional benefit. A partial stroke of paralysis delayed Mrs. Howell's return to Lincoln until two weeks ago when apparent improvement made the journey possible. Since her return her condition has grown steadily worse and death came at midnight on Monday.

Mrs. Howell leaves a wide circle of friends, especially in the University and friends of her daughter. Funeral services will be held this morning at 11 o'clock in the First Congregational Church, All Rhetoric classes are dismissed for the 11:30 period.


#### Hawkeye Club Meeting.
