MRS. HOWELL DIES.

Mother of Professor Howell Passes
 Away After Long Illness.
 Mrs. Harriet Howell, mother of Pro-
 fessor Alice Howell of the Depart-
 ment of Rhetoric, died Monday night
 at midnight after an illness lasting for
 more than a year.

Mrs. Howell was not at all well for
 the greater part of last year and went
 west with her daughter early in the
 summer in the hope of regaining her
 health. The greater part of the sum-
 mer was spent at Sadro-Wooley, Wash-
 ington, but a trip to Alaska was also
 made in the hope of additional benefit.
 A partial stroke of paralysis delayed
 Mrs. Howell's return to Lincoln until
 two weeks ago when apparent improve-
 ment made the journey possible. Since
 her return her condition has grown
 steadily worse and death came at mid-
 night on Monday.

Mrs. Howell leaves a wide circle of
 friends, especially in the University
 where she was widely known by pupils
 and friends of her daughter. Funeral
 services will be held this morning at
 11 o'clock in the First Congregational
 Church. All Rhetoric classes are dis-
 missed for the 11:30 period.
