TALK ON BIBLE STUDY.

Mr. McMillan Addresses University Men in Memorial Hall.

Mr. Neil McMillan, secretary of the International Committee of the Y. M. C. A., who has been traveling in the United States and Canada promoting Bible Study work among the institutions of higher learning, addressed the Sunday University Y. M. C. A. meeting. He spoke of the advance made in recent years in the study of the Bible. Men in state universities, colleges, normal schools, denominational schools and boys in high schools are taking up the devotional study of the Bible. Thirty-three thousand college men in the United States are enrolled in this work. Thru the influence of J. D. Rockefeller, Jr., and the International Committee over 250 men in the fashionable clubs of New York City are organized into groups which meet in their club rooms to study this Book of Books.

This study yields a large fund of information, bringing one into touch with the greatest players who have ever played the game of life. Chief among these is Christ himself. It helps in the formation of strong manhood and strengthens weak characters. This study will result in removing prejudice, correcting misunderstanding and developing a greater appreciation of the Bible, as the guide of a man's life.
