With us this blest Thanksgiving Day.

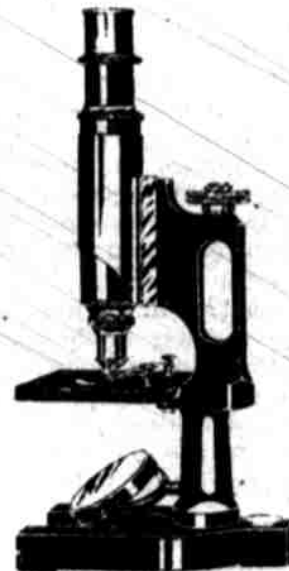
The cycle of the year rolls 'round,

A GOOD MICROSCOPE.

Professor Bessey Recommends New
Instrument for High School Use.

Professor Bessey has at last found
an American microscope which he is
willing to recommend to the teachers
of Botany in the high schools of the
state. It is made by the Bausch &
Lomb Optical Company of Rochester,
N. Y., and its general appearance is
shown in the accompanying cut. It is
called the “AH 1” microscope, and is
supplied with one eye-piece and two
objectives (2.3 and 1.6). It comes
packed in a neat walnut box with
handle and lock, and may be bought



for schools for \$20.25. It is durably
built and the “finish” of the instru-
ment is very attractive, while the op-
tical parts are excellent, and the mag-
nifying powers sufficient for the botan-
ical work of the high schools.

The special points of importance in
this microscope are its heavy iron
base, which gives it steadiness, the
large stage, the handle in the arm for
carrying the instrument, and the im-
proved micrometer focussing screw,
which is so made as not to be detach-
able.
