Latest Issue of Faculty Publication Contains Valuable Information.

The December issue of the University Journal has made its appearance and will soon be ready for general distribution. The Journal contains many articles of unusual merit and much University news of general interest.

The leading contribution is an article from the pen of Chancellor E. Benjamin Andrews on the subject of "Realism in Education." Dr. Andrews discusses the nature and effects of realism in a scholarly and helpful manner.

Professor Luckey continues his interesting record of the whereabouts and occupation of holders of the University teacher's certificate.

"Nebraska for Nebraskans" is the title of an historical article by Prof. C. E. Persinger. It deals with the work of the pioneer and the early territorial development of the state.

A statement of the changes in the control and the editorial staff of the Daily Nebraskan forms the basis of a short article.

Prof. John E. Almy makes some excellent suggestions to secondary teachers of Physics on experiments dealing with the inertia of matter and the pendulum.

The members of the University Botanical Seminar are given a personal write-up which shows strikingly the efficiency of the department of Botany.

"Normal Preparation for Music Teachers" is the subject of an article setting forth the nature of musical normal training and showing its wide extent.

Prof. M. M. Fogg writes an account of the formation of the new Central Debating Circuit of America—the largest debate league in the country—of which Nebraska is a member. Professor Fogg explains the working of the league and the method of debate preparation at Nebraska.

Professor Hodgeman's article on "Accredited Schools" is full of interesting notes on conditions in Nebraska's secondary schools.
